

For all the commands you need to remember this simple procedure:

- 1. Name of the dog (ONCE)
- 2. Command (ONCE) At the s
- 3. Hand signal (ONCE)
- At the same time
- Do not repeat them in any ways. Get used to saying once and making it happen.
- Make sure to make eye contact with your dog when you call its name.

Stand Command

This command starts with the dog in sit position on your left side.

- 1. Say the name of your dog,
- 2. Shorten up the leash and pull the leash forward either from the top or the side of the dog,
- 3. Step your right leg or stretch your arm forward.
- 4. Bring your right hand's pam flat and sweep forward beside the dog's head,
- 5. Ask your dog to stand and once it does, ask it to stay.
- 6. If the dog does not move or sits instead of standing, correct verbally, and repeat a few times.
- 7. You can also stroke the dog's side or belly right in the "soft spot" to keep it standing and focused on staying still.

Few uses for the stand command:

- When talking to a person.
- Ask a friend or family member to approach your dog and pat the dog slowly from head to tail.
- When visiting a store or a marketplace.
